Course Title: French II CP Course Number: 4111

Department: Foreign Languages Grade Level and Phase: 9CP

Length of Course: Year

Course Description:

French II is designed to increase students' knowledge of French. This course builds on vocabulary and concepts learned in the Middle School French I classes. This course is taught as much as possible in French. We will utilize audio and video resources as well as the Masconomet language laboratory to improve oral proficiency and expression and increase and solidify vocabulary, pronunciation, and grammar. Students will also learn about French history, geography, and culture as well as the French-speaking (Francophone) world.

Objectives:

The students will be able to:

- A. increase their comprehension of spoken French.
- B. increase their ability to converse in uncomplicated French situations, e.g. talking about likes and dislikes, feelings, needs, etc.
- C. increase their ability to read French without direct translation.
- D. improve their French pronunciation.
- E. learn new vocabulary items for each lesson and/or topic discussed in class.
- F. learn new grammatical structures and use them in written and oral work.
- G. become familiar with the difference between American and French customs, situations, history, interpersonal relations and civilization.

Materials and Activities:

- A. Active vocabulary is built and practiced through regular discussion of events in the students' lives, current films and school events.
- B. Films, songs, slides and teacher experiences are used to present cultural material.

- D. Written homework assignments and oral drills are used to build grammatical skills.
- E. Reading assignments are used to build vocabulary, reinforce correct grammatical patterns, and give a context for discussion.
