Course Title: Spanish II Honors

Course Number: 4351

Department: Foreign Languages

Grade Level and Phase: 9 Honors

Length of Course: Year

Course Description:

Spanish II H is a continuation of Spanish I and the first course in the honors program. Students learn more advanced grammar and expand their vocabulary by using the language in activities, projects, and assignments. Interpersonal communication is emphasized and strengthened by the exclusive use of Spanish in the classroom by students and teacher. Students practice more complicated language, including past and future tenses, through written and oral presentation. Interpretive skills are expanded through authentic and prepared readings, audio recordings and video clips. Students explore other cultures via authentic material online and other presentations.

Objectives:

The students will be able to:

- A. write and speak in Spanish to the level commensurate with the content of this course.
- B. show an understanding of similarities and differences between their culture and Spanish-speaking cultures.
- C. understand authentic materials in Spanish appropriate to the level of this course.
- D. write a well-constructed composition in Spanish about an important issue.
- E. collaborate with peers in Spanish to complete activities and projects.
- F. employ circumlocution to communicate in Spanish without translating.

- A. *Exprésate 2.* Holt. This is the primary text, which includes ancillary workbooks, text, and media. (Chapters 1-9)

Assessments:

- A. Exams:
