Course Title: Spanish IV CP Course Number: 4331

Department: Foreign Languages Grade Level and Phase: 12 CP

Length of Course: Year

Course Description:

Spanish IV is a course based on the literary analysis of modern short stories and the review of previously learned grammar. An integral part of the course is daily conversation in Spanish, with stress placed on vocabulary building through students' original oral presentations and textbook work. Cultural material is presented through readings, movies, projects and teacher/student experiences in Spanish speaking countries. The video adventure Destinos is used to develop listening comprehension and frame the cultural activities of this course. Students will work in the language laboratory to improve their listening and speaking skills and will participate in group work and projects that meet their individual needs and interests.

Objectives:

The student will be able to:

- A. use written and oral language reviewed in this course with accuracy and facility
- B. read and analyze modern short stories
- C. understand the influence of history on literature.
- D. write short stories and poetry in Spanish
- E. show an understanding of the differences between Hispanic and American culture.
- F. understand a native speaker using vocabulary according to the student's exposure
- G. read and discuss current events from a daily Spanish newspaper

H. function in large group and small group situations.

Materials and Activities:

A. Class discussions of daily news items and pressing current events are used to practice and build active

vocabulary.

B. Lectures are used to present structure and grammar, cultural information, literary techniques and

historical information.

C. Group Work: In group short story reading, students learn how to apply the techniques of literary analysis

and to prepare a finished presentation. In small group grammar exercises, students help each other work on

exercises to insure clarity and control of concepts. They will also write up and act out skits using new

vocabulary which is being studied.

- D. Aural/Oral Experience: Listening/comprehension tapes and <u>Destinos</u> videos are used to strengthen
 Comprehension skills.
- E. Reports, compositions, short story writing: Students will be able to report on culture to confirm

understanding of cultural topics. They will also write original short stories.

- F. Non-printed Material: Films, videos, slides, teacher and student experiences, the Internet and on-line resources are used to present cultural information.
- G. Students Oral Reports: Students are expected to discuss chosen cultural topics with the class.

Assessment:
