Course Title: Jazz I Course Number: 8631

Department: Music Grade Level and Phase 9-12; H

Length of Course: 3 PPC; 2 Semesters

Course Description:

Jazz I performs jazz compositions written or arranged for the standard big band or swing band. The instrumentation used for Jazz I will comprised of three sections: saxophones, trombones, and trumpets. The size of each section may range from three to seven students dependant upon number of and ability level of the students who audition for the Jazz I. In addition a rhythm section that is comprised of one piano player, one bass player, one drummer, one guitarist, and one auxiliary percussionist is also utilized. The instruments which comprise the "rhythm section" may have multiple students assigned to the parts depending on the results of the placement auditions. On occasions flutes, clarinets, and French horns may be used, but not on a regular basis. Jazz I plays traditional big band swing, Latin jazz, as well jazz adaptations of rock and funk. Jazz I performs at several school concerts as well as provides music for several school assemblies. Jazz I may also participate at district and state festivals and competitions. Jazz I is considered a select ensemble and all students interested in joining are required to audition for the music director. Auditions are held on the last Wednesday of September. Jazz I rehearse from 6:00-8:00 on Wednesdays beginning on the first Wednesday in October and concluding on the last Wednesday in May.

Objectives:

All students enrolled in Jazz I will:

- A. demonstrate a high level of proficiency on their chosen instrument
- B. demonstrate a high level of proficiency at playing in a variety of jazz styles including contemporary swing, traditional swing, Latin, rock fusion, and funk, with emphasis on appropriate style, intonation, rhythmic precision, steady tempo, and dynamic contrasts
- C. demonstrate a desire to explore a variety of recorded performances through the use of internet technology such as YouTube as well other online services
- D. demonstrate a positive attitude, a willingness to contribute to the ensemble, and a desire to provide leadership
- E. demonstrate a positive attitude, a willingness to contribute to the program, and a desire to provide leadership
